In the sixteenth century, new interpretations of Christian

Hermetism were explored until this connection between pagan and Christian was increasingly criticized by scholars who argued that Hermetism was neither as ancient as was thought nor as close to Christianity. The theory was abandoned in scientific milieu from the seventeenth century onwards, whereas Hermetic theosophy, on the contrary, survived in esoteric circles.
