Back in the present, the children's grandmother provides the book's overriding message, stoutly reassuring them that "[f]aith means believing with your heart and not with your eyes." It's a tidy moral, but Del Campo's prose style as she delivers it is never labored or



heavy-handed. The book's brevity and thoughtfulness may make it an ideal supplement for Bible study classes, in which it may prompt lively discussion. A well-turned time-travel adventure story with a biblical edge.
