Artificial Darkness Noam M. He has no part in what is going on and is so removed from life that the mauling of an actor by a tiger cannot deflect him from filming the action. The *Notebooks of Serafino Gubbio* is set in Rome circa 1915, partly on a film set, partly in the city.
